Math With Mr. Kaya!

Here is a summary of what we have been learning this month!

Our grade 5's and 6 class have been using addition, subtraction, multiplication and division to solve problems involving large numbers with the aid of technology (if needed). They have been learning to identify multiples and common multiples, and then solve problems involving multiples and common multiples!

The Grade 7 Students have been working with fractions and decimals! (Mixed numbers; add, subtract, multiply and divide decimals; and percent).

Learning Activities:

Students explored and use the concept of benchmarks for the use in ordering fractions, patterns of division by multiples of 10, and skills to find the cost of items that have been reduced or taxed.



Math With Ms. Savin

In Math 8 students completed their unit on Integers and now we are beginning to study perfect squares and square roots.

In Math 9 students completed their unit on rational numbers and now we are beginning to study coordinate planes and solving and linear equations.

After that, we will be graphing linear relation on coordinate planes.

Science With Ms. Polique

Students have been working hard in Science this month! Here is a list of everything we have been learning about!

- Sci 5 Human impacts on Wetlands, adaptations for Wetlands and food Webs
- Sci 6 Branching patterns, leaves and parts of a tree

- Sci 8 Density, buoyancy, and pressure

Grade 8 - We have been studying the Renaissance With a focus on the changes that occurred in how man began to view their purpose in a more humanistic view. With this focus, we have looked at developments in the arts, science, mathematics, travel, and economics that affect us to this day. Time is also spent every class on current events, and analyzing sources to develop media interpretive skills.

Social 9- Social Studies 9 is an achievement exam course that introduces students to the Workings of the Canadian government. In these first two months we have focused on the executive power, legislative power, and judicial power of the federal government. In the most recent weeks we have looked at the YCJA and how it affects them as youth.

ELA grade 8/9 are working on reviewing elements of literature - students who were here last week can name all 6! We will be going over these elements in more detail over the next few weeks while we analyze short stories. We are also learning about figurative language. We read, we discuss, and we view videos so all types of learners can engage with the material. We also practice it. The students will be doing the required Read Theory practice. The plan is to do this a minimum of 3 times before the deadline to get a relevant assessment. So far, this is where we are at!
