Math With Mr. Kaya!

Grade 7:Here is a summary of what we have been learning this month!

Throughout the month of December we have been completing the Integers Unit. Students modeled integers with colored tiles. They solved problems involving adding integers using colored tiles and number lines, subtracting integers using colored tiles and number lines, and finally adding and subtracting integers.

I Can Statements



9.1 Explore Integer Addition

I can add integers using integer chips

9.2 Add Integers

I can add integers using a number line.

9.3 Explore Integer Subtraction

I can subtract integers using integer chips.

9.4 Subtract Integer

I can use addition to subtract integers.

9.5 Apply Integer Operations

I can decide when to add and subtract integers in solving problems.

Grade 5/6: In the first three weeks of December we completed the Patterns and Equations unit and started the Angles and Polygons unit.

Students learned:

- · Describe patterns and relationships using graphs and tables.
- · Use equations to represent number relationships.
- · Use relationships within tables of values to solve problems.
- · Identify and plot points in a Cartesian plane.
- · Demonstrate the preservation of equality.



Math 8: In December students learned how to:

- Demonstrate an understanding of multiplying and dividing positive fractions and mixed numbers, concretely, pictorially and symbolically.
- Apply the order of operations to fraction problems.

Students completed the unit with a unit test.

Math 9: In December students learned how to:

- -Generalize a pattern arising from a problem-solving context, using a linear equation, and verify by substitution.
- -Graph a linear relation, analyze the graph, and interpolate or extrapolate to solve problems.

 Students completed the Linear Relations Unit with a unit test.

Sci 5: In December we completed our Electricity and Magnetism unit. In January we are starting a unit focussing on Mechanisms using Electricity.

Sci 6: We are close to completing the Sky Science Unit. We have two more topics to complete in January and then we will be moving on to Air and Aerodynamics.

Sci 7: We finished the Plants for Food and Fibre unit. In January we are focusing on Heat and Temperature.

Sci 8: We completed the Cells and Systems unit in December. In January we will focus on Light and Optics.

Sci 9: We completed Chemistry in December. In January, our focus will be Environmental Chemistry.

Powerschool update

What is Student Contacts?

Student Contacts is an update to PowerSchool SIS that allows for greater flexibility in the type and amount of Parent/Guardians and Emergency Contacts that are connected to your child(ren). It will also unify your contact information across all of your children in the Division.

What will change for me?

Your information will now be unified across all schools in the Division that you are connected to (as a parent/guardian or emergency contact). Instead of having data entered at each school, you will have one set of contact information. Schools will be able to connect your information to your child(ren) at each school, whether you are a Parent, Guardian or Emergency Contact.

Why is this change happening?

There are many benefits of consolidating and updating student contact data:

- -Data accuracy is important to ensure we can reach the correct person.
- -Additional relationship types.

Great Moon Pronounced- Kiss- ee-pee-sim

Happy New Year and Welcome to 2023! This year is promising to be an exciting New Year filled with possibilities and hope. Traditionally, during this time and for the next few months, we experience the harshest weather of the year. This is a time where all living things require extra kindness and care to survive.

So far in our moon journey together, we have discovered that the Cree language is very descriptive. Words are chosen to create a picture in your mind. Each moon's name has been based on what we see happening on the earth around us. This explains why various groups of First Nations people have different names for the moons depending on where they are located. For example, in Eastern Canada where the Mohawk live, they call this moon TSIOTHOHRHKÓ:WA, which means BIGGER COLD MOON. If you could name this moon using descriptive language what would you call it? Once you have come up with a name for the moon, try doing some research to find all the different names for this moon. Have a beautiful month.


Diploma exams must be administered in accordance with the scheduled dates and times.
