Math With Mr. Kaya!

In January the Math 5 and 6 students started a new unit, the Angles and Polygons.


Students learned:

- Name, describe and classify angles
- Estimate and determine angle measures
- Draw and label angles
- · Provide examples of angles in the environment
- Investigate the sum of angles in triangles and quadrilaterals




In January the math 7 students started a new unit, the Circles and Area.

Students investigated and explained the relationships among radius, diameter and circumference of a circle. They determined the sum of the central angles of a circle and constructed circles and solved problems involving circles. Students developed formulas to find the areas of a parallelogram and a triangle.




Math With Ms. Savin

Math 8: In grade 8 students are starting to study a brand new unit on rates and ratios. Students began the unit by learning how to simplify ratios and find equivalent ratios. They are now beginning to work on solving unit rates.




- Please note that students re-writing Diploma exams must register through Mypass. Any questions, please contact us.
- Registrations of courses are completed on a case-by-case basis. However, 5 credit courses MUST be started no later than April 1st.


