

Math with Mr. Kaya!

In February, grade 5 and 6 students continued to study the Angles and Polygons unit.

Students learned:

- Investigate the sum of the interior angles of a triangle.
- Investigate the sum of the interior angles of a quadrilateral.
- Solve problems involving angles with quadrilaterals and triangles.
- Investigate the angles in parallel lines.



In February, grade 7 students continued to study the Circles and Area unit.

Students investigated and explained the relationships among radius, diameter and circumference of a circle. They determined the sum of the central angles of a circle and constructed circles and solved problems involving circles. Students developed formulas to find the areas of a parallelogram, a triangle and a circle. They drew, labeled and interpreted circle charts.




Math 8: This month in grade 8 math we completed our unit on Rates, Ratios and Proportions. We are now focusing on Percents. Students are converting fractions and decimals to percentages.



Math 9 :This month in grade 9 math we completed our unit on Inequalities. We are now focusing on adding and subtracting polynomials.

Students completed a 30 day mental health challenge. They studied different types of mental health conditions, how to maintain our mental health and completed a project on suicide prevention.


Science with Ms. Poliquin!

Science 5: We completed our unit on Mechanisms using Electricity and have moved on to study chemistry. We had fun creating butterflies while using chromatography to separate substances.
Science 6: Our Grade 6 students completed their study of Sky Science and are now studying Flight. Thus far we have built and tested models of planes, hot air balloons and parachutes.

Science 7: The Grade 7 students finished up a short unit on heat and temperature. We are now working on Structures and Forces. Students built and tested a structure designed to protect an egg falling from a height of 3 m on our February Flex Friday.

Science 8: The Grade 8 students completed their unit on light and optics. We are now investigating machines, work and energy. Students built a working wagon out of paper on Flex Friday.

Science 9: Science 9 students completed their unit on Environmental Chemistry with a final project. They began studying Electricity.

LA 5-7: The 5-7's just wrapped up their Personal Narrative Unit, and have just begun their next Novel Study... they are flying right into Silverwing by Kenneth Oppel!

Social 5-7: The 5-7's have been learning about 3 First Nations Societies, The Mi'kmaq, the Haudenosaunee and the Ojibwe. Next up we will be learning about the key figures in French Exploration and Settlement of North America.

PE 5-9 :The 5-9s have been learning different ways to move their body to music in our Dance Unit! We have learned the routines to both the Cadillac Ranch and the Electric Slide!

Health 5-7 : In Health class we have been discussing the word integrity and what it means to be a person of integrity. We have had insightful discussions about how we can show integrity in our everyday lives.

Music - 5-7: In Music class students have started working on their Musical Artist Research Project, each student will be researching and presenting an artist of their choice to the class!

Film Studies 5-9:Film Studies students have started their next Film of choice, Alice in Wonderland! Throughout the film we will be pausing to reflect on various questions and ponder what we would do in certain situations!

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Social 8/9 with MS. Waller

The Social 8 students recently completed a project where they narrated a day in the life of an Aztec citizen. Students wrote about merchants, mothers, soldiers, and children and creatively showed what life was like in Aztec society. They are now learning about Spanish history, society and culture.

The Social 9 students have been studying immigration and learning about the experience of immigrants and how the Canadian government determines who can immigrate to Canada. Our next project is to write an essay about how well current immigration policies meet the needs of Canadians.

We recently wrapped up our poetry unit - great job everyone! Creative and clever responses were submitted by all when tasked with writing their own poetry .

The next several weeks will be dedicated to our novel study - we will be reading the novel Refugee, by Alan Gratz. This is a fantastic novel, so I am really excited to read this with the students. During the novel study we will also start focusing on essay writing. Should be an awesome month!

CYBERWORLD: WHAT HAPPENS WHEN YOUTH PRESS SEND?

In this presentation from the Saffron Centre, parents and caregivers will be provided with information about online safety. This night is designed for adults, and not suitable for children. Topics will be of mature content and include popular websites, games, and apps that are being used by children and youth such as TikTok, Instagram, and Snapchat. Included in the presentation will be the discussion around pornography, sexting, and sexual exploitation. Legal consequences will be discussed as well as how to approach these conversations with your child (ren). The discussion of rising crime in Canada since the start of the Covid-19 pandemic works to define the issue and review the Criminal Code of Canada. Saffron will discuss the effects of online exploitation, different techniques for stranger and peer perpetrated exploitation. The presentation will conclude with some tips for intervention and a practice scenario to work through as a group. Videos on the effects of social media, approaching the conversation about pornography, and the online sexual exploitation process will be shown.

Topics Covered: safe screen time tips, safety tips for different platforms (YouTube and Google), social media safety tips and terms and conditions (TikTok, Instagram, Snapchat), online gaming safety tips, Discord, live streaming, pornography, sexting, communication, helpful tools, online child sexual exploitation and its forms [content warning provided], online grooming techniques, peer sexual exploitation, signs of online child sexual exploitation, tips for intervention.
