Examining Historical Worldviews

The Goal of Social Studies

Responsible citizenship is the ultimate goal of Social Studies. Citizenship education is based upon an understanding of history in relation to current affairs, diversity between people and places, perspectives towards decision-making and economies, and connecting locally and globally. It is organized around knowledge and skill-building, however its primary focus is the development of student values and attitudes. This is necessary for lifelong learning.

Why do we study these following areas?

This course will allow us to explore how intercultural contact between societies leads to significant change and alters each society's worldview.

General Outcome 8.1 ~ From Isolation to Adaptation: Japan

You will demonstrate an understanding and appreciation of the ways in which beliefs, values and knowledge shape worldviews and contribute to a society's isolation or adaptation.

To appreciate how a society's worldview:

- is shaped by time and location
- influences its choice to be isolated
- affects how it governs and makes decisions
- shapes its citizens and the country's identity

General Outcome 8.2 ~ Origins of a Western Worldview: Renaissance Europe

You will demonstrate an understanding and appreciation of how the exchange of ideas and knowledge helped shape the worldview of the western world.

To appreciate:

- how Renaissance Europe shaped the worldview of the western world
- differing beliefs, values and worldviews
- how beliefs and values are shaped by time, geographic location and society

General Outcome 8.3 ~ Worldviews in Conflict: The Spanish and the Aztecs

You will demonstrate an understanding and appreciation of how intercultural contact impacts the worldviews of societies.

You will appreciate:

- how a society's worldview influences its choices, decisions and interactions with others
- how Aztec and Spanish identities and worldviews were impacted by contact with different cultures
- how rapid adaptations can radically change a society's beliefs, values and knowledge
