Important Course Information

Health and life skills involve learning about the habits, behaviors, interactions and decisions related to healthy daily living and planning for the future.

The <u>Alberta Program of Studies</u> determines what students are expected to learn in health courses. These expectations are called learning outcomes. The learning outcomes are organized into the following strands:

*Human Sexuality Education Human sexuality education is offered in Grade 4 to Grade 9 as a mandatory component of the program of studies. All human sexuality outcomes have been bolded and italicized to assist in identification of these outcomes. Parents will retain the right to exempt their child from school instruction in human sexuality education. Schools will provide alternative learning experiences for those students who have been exempted from human sexuality instruction by their parents.

Learning in an Online Environment

This course is delivered to you in an online environment. You will access your class through Google Classroom. You can look forward to using resources such as interactive multimedia and the Internet for various activities. Computer simulations, multimedia, graphics, and electronic information will also be available to support your learning. Recording video or taking pictures of others without consent is not permitted.
